We feed Milwaukee County's youth healthy food to help young minds grow.

Milwaukee County day care centers depend on us to prepare and deliver healthy meals. It's something we take seriously as we serve more than 90 sites and prepare 3000 meals daily.

Our food service monitors also visit sites we serve to ensure the best quality and food wholesomeness.

### **Free Summer Meal Programs**

When school lets out each summer, many young people will not get a nutritious meal required for a healthy diet. SDC's summer meal program fills this need by providing free meals at easily accessible locations throughout Milwaukee County.





## Adults

As a community action agency, we provide resources to help Milwaukee County residents move beyond poverty. Sometimes this means making sure that people have food to eat. SDC's Food Nutrition Services program prepares and provides meals for the homeless at various sites throughout Milwaukee County. Currently we provide 14,000 individual meals monthly, to four hotels for homeless individuals and families in Milwaukee County.

## General Guidelines for Participation:

During the school year, meals are served daily at daycare centers, tutorial programs and after-school recreation centers. Children (up to 18 years of age) must be enrolled in a program to participate.

- After-school centers must be non-profit and county-certified or state-licensed.
- Day care centers may be profit or non-profit.
