Public Comments

Antoinette Ashley new SDC Executive Administrative Support Specialist introduced herself to the Commission . She shared her new position and previous experiences

SDC Governance & Executive Support Manager, Abra Fortson reported the passing of Hattie Daniels. She told the Commission that SDC would send its expression of condolences & regards in a floral arrangement. Pardeep Kaleka shared the funeral arrangements with the Commission.

A motion was made to approval the March 17, 2022 Board of Commissioners meeting minutes by:

Donna Brown-Martin. The motion was second by John Jacobs. The motion carried.

Chairperson's report:

Commission Chair, Elmer Moore Jr. welcomed new staff.

Chair Moore Jr. acknowledged the election of the Cavalier Johnson as Mayor of The City of Milwaukee. He noted that this was significant and historical accomplishment given that he is the city's first Black elected Mayor.

Chair Moore noted Mayor Johnson's great familiarity with SDC and looks forward to growing engagement.

Chairman Moore asked Abra Fortson to review the outcomes for the 2022 district five& six election.

She reported the following:

District 5 Election Results:

SDC Governance Committee Chairman, Matthew Boswell asked reported that there were no concerns expressed as issues in this election and noted that it was well run. He thanked Ms. Fortson for a smooth process.

Discussion:

Ms. Fortson told the board that the final month for Commissioner Rucka would be the May 19th Board Meeting. She said that even though the annual meeting had been moved to October, it would still be in alignment with the board calendar to transition in May to onboard new commissioners for the June meeting. Ms. Fortson said that all awards and accolades and officer elections that would typically occur at the former June Annual meeting would be held in October.

She noted that Serina Chavez would be eligible to begin immediately given that the district five seat is currently vacant. She that District 6 would onboard by the June meeting.

A motion was made to accept the results for the 2022 District 5 and 6 elections as reported: by Barbara Toles. Kimberly Njoroge seconded the motion. The motion carried.

CEO report:

SDC CEO, Dr. George Hinton expressed his condolences at the passing of Former Commission Member Hattie Daniels Rush. He said that he has a profound respect for her work and contribution to Milwaukee County.

Dr. Hinton said that SDC is busy. He said that on the last day of the tax season he needed to close services out intermitted due to the large influx of late filers. He reported that to not cause further delay to participants SDC filed more than more than one thousand extensions.

Marketing Report:

SDC Marketing Specialists, Chantell Sain shared a quick video of the Youth Services, Youth Empowerment Workshops series which is a 9-week program expected to restart in May and will serve 7-18.

A unique feature of this program is to encourage families to join youth by making space and time for guardians to come help and learn to navigate parenthood with art therapy and experienced testimonials

Research Advocacy & Public Policy:

SDC Public Policy Manager, Jennifer Harris reported that she had finalized assembling the Committee on Commissioners work. She noted that members of this committee included:

Poverty Summit

SDC Governance & Executive Support Manager, Abra Fortson reported that efforts were underway to plan for the big Summit on Poverty Planning Coalition kick off for 2022.

She thanked Commissioner Barbara Toles for agreeing to Chair the Coalition again this year.

She reported that this year SDC is in conversation with the Alliance of Hispanic Professionals and All of Us to collaborate on the Summit on Poverty with a concentrated effort around Covid-19 and its impact on Milwaukee County.

Financial Report:

SDC Director of Finance, Patrick Kirsenlohr reviewed the SDC Financials.

SD Foundation Update:

SD Foundation Board Chairwoman, Alicia Smith-McCants reported the following:

There is lots of activities happening around the 2022 Legacy Gala. She reported that the SD Foundation has received verbal commitments from Marquette University for \$20k and The UPS foundation for \$15k all towards the Legacy Gala.

Ms. Smith-McCants reported that she has upcoming meetings with donors who supported previous art therapy programs; plans to share the ideas with him nest week. Shea also appealed to SDC Commissioners to take time to meet with her to advance the collective efforts.

Commissioners, Barbara Toles, and Dr. Chia Vang also encouraged all commission members to take time to connect for a meeting with Ms. Smith-McCants.


