Board Chairman Elmer Moore Jr. called the Thursday, January 18, 2024 SDC Board of Commissioners meeting to order at 5:38pm.

Chairperson's report:

SDC's marketing team presented a video in memory of SDC's previous Attorney James Hall Jr. Board Chairman Elmer Moore Jr. discussed Attorney Hall's achievements and the impact has had on him.

CEO report:

SDC CEO, Dr. George Hinton followed up on the conversation of James Hall Jr. passing. He noted that if it where not for his encounters with Attorney Hall, he would not be present at SDC today. Dr. Hinton stated that there will be new elections coming soon and some board members will be transitioning out due to their cycle ending. It was also stated that SDC Board Commissioner Serina Chavez will be departing from her position as a board member due to her moving out of her district area. Dr. Hinton noted that the VITA tax season will be starting soon.

Barbara Toles questioned if SDC was looking for intake specialists and greeters for the VITA program and what the job responsibilities where.



Dr. Hinton stated he would send out the job description to the full board for the VITA volunteer program.

Chairman Moore Jr. announced Dr. Chia Youyee Vang and Dr. Brett Seamons departure from SDC's board of commissioner.

Financial Report:

SDC Finance director, Patrick Kirsenlohr, reported on SDC's accounting department being busy. They are working collecting of funds owed to SDC. He also stated that he will be looking to get the audit done for 2023 in July.

SD Foundation Update:

Aaron Hurvitz, SD-Foundation Major Donor & Development, reported on the foundation partnership with PENSI spices raised over \$16,000 from 600 new donors, far exceeding typical returns. New donor data and contacts expanded outreach capabilities.

SDC Grant Writer Barbara McKillop presented briefing paper BP2759.

SDC Marketing Supervisor Chantell Sain reported on SDC's VITA program. She reported that VITA tax preparation begins January 22nd at two sites due to chase closure. Volunteers are urgently needed for the reduced capacity program supporting expected high demand. Opportunities include tax preparation, intake and greeting. Training is provided and experience is not required.

Committee on Commission Work

SDC Public Policy Manager, Jennifer Harris provided updates on SDC's strategic planning process and numerous research initiatives in the areas of maternal health, chronic disease, gun violence, and the housing stock. Funding applications were submitted to several organizations.

SDC Executive Support & Governmental Affairs Manager, Abra Fortson, provided Government Affairs Update. Abra discussed meeting with a foundation regarding funding for SDC's Racial Equity Institute. Concerns were raised about the name and lack of documentation. Fundraising and revenue generation ideas were proposed. Abra discussed plans to invite Dr. Bernice King as a keynote speaker. Early childhood education advocacy was tabled for further discussion due to election year sensitivities
